We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our children's success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. We ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- 1. Attends school daily and arrives on time, ready for the day's learning experience
- 2. Works no less than an hour from home each evening
- 3. Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life
- 4. Seeks out help when it is needed
- 5. Knows that you expect him/her to succeed in school and go on to college or some other post-secondary training

Student Handbook

The entire student body participated in a week long review of the expectations in the Handbook. They even took a test and everyone passed! If you have any questions about our expectations, you can find them in your child's agenda. He/She should have this at school at all times. We are teaching students how to use the agenda as a tool to manage their time and set goals. Please look in your child's agenda frequently.

Attendance

Daily attendance is very important. If your child will be absent, please call the front desk staff at 792-0306 (just dial 9) to let us know. Remember that the absence will be rendered "excused" if your child does no less than 4 hours of coursework in Edgenuity. This time must be productive time and not excessively idle. Please also turn in any doctor's notes for visits to excuse absences. When your child has 3, 5, 7, and 10 unexcused absences, please expect to see a letter in the mail. This letter is required on this schedule according to the New Mexico Compulsory Attendance Law. The letter is a template from the state. Truancy is very detrimental to your child's success. If you receive one of these letters, please know that it is an attempt to reach out to you to remedy what ever is causing your child to be absent. We have a number of attendance interventions that we use to support you and your child. Also please be aware that all absences are reported to the state and the Federal Department of Education as a requirement of No Child Left Behind.

Discovery Education Assessment

The Discovery short cycle assessment will be taken during the week of August 22th. The students are assessed in the areas of reading and math according to the Common Core standards three times per year. The TGA instructional staff uses the data from this assessment to determine the standards in which your child may need extra assistance. The time of day that this focused intervention is provided is during 7th period. While this is the last period of the day, it is very important that your child is in attendance. The state test has changing from the SBA (Standards Based Assessment) to the PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers). This new assessment is computer based and is based on the Common Core Standards. The Common Core Standards are a new way of thinking for many students. We expect all students to need some type of intervention. Please respect the 7th period intervention time and be sure to allow your child to be here consistently until 5pm, when our school day ends.
